PRESENTERS



Rabbi Daniel Feldman is a Rosh Yeshiva at the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary at Yeshiva University, as well as an instructor in the Sy Syms School of Business, and has taught for the Wurzweiler School of Social Work and the

Katz School of Continuing Education. He also serves as the Executive Editor of the RIETS initiative of YU Press. He is an alumnus of Yeshivat Kerem B'Yavneh and received his ordination (Yoreh Yoreh and Yadin Yadin) from the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary, where he was a fellow of the Bella and Harry Wexner Kollel Elyon. He has authored extensively and is the co-editor of more than ten volumes of Talmudic essays and Jewish Thought. Rabbi Feldman is also a rav of Ohr Saadya in Teaneck, NJ.



Rabbi Efrem Goldberg is the Senior Rabbi of the Boca Raton Synagogue (BRS), a rapidly-growing congregation of over 850 families in Boca Raton, Florida. He is the posek of the community mikvah, the cochairman of the ORB kashrus committee,

a member of the RCA South Florida Regional Beis Din for conversion, and the treasurer of the Rabbinical Council of America.



Rabbi Aryeh Lebowitz is the director of Semichah at RIETS as well as the Mora D'asra of Beis Haknesses of North Woodmere, NY. He was previously a rebbe at Lander's College for Men and an eleventh grade Rebbe at the DRS Yeshiva

High School (HALB). Rabbi Aryeh Lebowitz gives a world renowned Daf Yomi Shiur where he maps out the Daf in a clear and concise manner. Additionally he brings out many points of Iyun which relate to Halacha L'masseh.



Dr. Carolyn Fein Levy is a pediatric oncologist at Schneider Children's Hospital, part of the North Shore-LIJ health system, and an assistant professor of pediatrics at Albert Einstein College of Medicine. Her main clinical focus is

the treatment of rare pediatric tumors, particularly germ cell tumors, sarcomas of the soft tissues and bone as well as childhood leukemia. She is an active member of the Children's Oncology Group, an organization dedicated to clinical research in the field of pediatric cancer. Currently, Dr. Fein Levy is involved in several research trials studying the biology of solid tumors and the implementation of new drugs and treatment plans that improve the long-term survival of cancer patients. Dr. Fein Levy has recently been charged with the responsibility for developing the Adolescent and Young Adult Oncology (AYA) Program for the health system. She has been on the medical board of Camp Simcha since 1999.



Rabbi Isaac Rice received semicha from Yeshiva University. Rabbi Rice is a rabbi at Congregation Anshei Chesed in Hewlett, NY and head of the Halacha department at the SKA High School for Girls in Long Island, New York.



Rabbi Yonason Sacks is the Rosh HaYeshiva of the Beis Medrash L'Talmud - Lander College for Men. A leading posek and author of 20 seforim, Rabbi Sacks descends from a long line of illustrious rabbinic personalities. For 18

years Rabbi Sacks served as Rosh Yeshiva at Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary (RIETS) at Yeshiva University, where he was ordained and awarded with an advanced rabbinic ordination. He has been the rabbi of Agudas Yisroel Bircas Yaakov in Passaic, N.J. for more than 20 years.

PRESENTERS



Rabbi Shay Schachter is the Rosh Beis Midrash at the Young Israel of Woodmere, overseeing it's extensive educational programs. He is the Halachik advisor for Yachad, the Orthodox Union's division for indi-

viduals with developmental disabilities. Since 2017 he has served as Rabbi in Camp Simcha, Chai Lifeline's camp for children battling cancer and chronic illnesses.



Rabbi Elan Segelman is the rabbinic director for PUAH in America. After studying in Israel for two years at Yeshivat Kerem B'Yavneh, Rabbi Segelman attained a B.A. in Psychology from Touro College's Lander College for Men, as well as an

M.A. from Touro College's Graduate School of Jewish Studies. Shortly after completing his Semicha, he was appointed as a Shoel U'Maishiv and Rebbe in the Lander College Judaic Studies Program. Rabbi Segelman currently serves as the Rabbinic Educator at New York Medical College & Touro College of Dental Medicine in Valhalla, NY. Rabbi Segelman resides in Queens, NY, where he serves as the rabbi of Kehilas Torah Temima. He is the founder and Rosh Kollel of the Queens Kollel Boker, as well as the Rabbinic Director of Special Projects for the Vaad Harabonim of Queens.



Rabbi Zvi Sobolofsky is a Rosh Yeshiva at Yeshiva University. Rabbi Sobolofsky studied at Yeshivat Kerem B'Yavneh and Yeshiva University; graduating in 1987, he was named valedictorian of the Mazer Yeshiva Program. He then attended the

Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary (RIETS), receiving smicha in 1990 and earned a Master's degree from the Azrieli Graduate School of Jewish Education and Administration. He was a fellow of the Gruss Kollel Elyon and then went on to teach in Yeshiva University's Stone Beis Medrash Program before being appointed as a Rosh Yeshiva in 2002. He is the author of two sefarim, Reishis Koach, on Maseches Bechoros, and The Laws and Concepts of Niddah. In addition to his role as Rosh Yeshiva at RIETS and spiritual leader of Ohr HaTorah, he also lectures at the Bergen County Beis Medrash Program (BCBM) housed at Congregation Bnai Yeshurun in Teaneck, NJ.



Rabbi Daniel Stein is a Rosh Yeshiva at the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary (RIETS), where he holds the Perez and Frieda Friedberg Chair in Talmud. Rabbi Stein is also the director of the Norman and Johanne Sternthal

Fourth Year Halachah Lemaaseh Program at RIETS where he teaches Jewish Law and tests students for ordination. He also serves as Rabbi of Congregation Ahavath Chesed, known as The Ridniker Shteibel, on Manhattan's Upper West Side.
